



## SUBMISSION OF SHORT COMMUNICATION

Short communication represents the work that extends previously published research, small scale *in-vitro/in-vivo* studies and reports etc. Authors must clearly explain the work upon which they are building, which may be published or not.

Short communications submitted to IJPIB should contain following sections

*Title page, Keywords, Introduction, Findings, Conclusion, Acknowledgement, References, Illustrations and Figures, Tables.*

**Title page** should provide title of the article, with names of the authors with institutional/industrial/association address indicating corresponding author with asterisk. Author should avoid abbreviations in title.

**Abstract** should not exceed 300 words giving the brief information that highlights recent developments in specific area.

**Keywords** should be a maximum of 8 words with 3 words minimum.

**Findings** include brief statement of research contention, methods used and results. Instead this section can be broken into informative headings.

**Conclusion** should clearly explain the importance of the review envisaged.

**Acknowledge** (not mandatory) anyone who gave the support or guidance or inspiring suggestions for successful completion of your work.

**References** should be kept in square brackets within the text and number consecutively. Each reference must have individual reference number and avoid excessive referencing.

### **Examples of reference styles in IJPIB**

*Article within Journal*

**Author name. Title of work done. Short form of journal. Year: Volume: Page number.**

eg: Shubham Rai<sup>1</sup>. Mohd Yasir et al. Cinnarizine loaded lipid based system: preparation, optimization and *in-vitro* evaluation. IOSR Journal of Pharmacy. 2012: Volume 2 Issue 5: p 47-56.



*A Chapter in a book*

**Author name. Chapter name. Editor name. Book name. Publisher: Year: Page number.**

eg: Rogert K.Middleton. adverse drug reactions. Donna S. Wall. Remington. Pharmaceutical press – London: 2013: p 2013 – 2022.

*Complete book*

**Author name. Name of the book. Tag line if any. Ed. Publisher: Year.**

eg: Dr A.K. Seth. Pharmaceutical Microbiology. A laboratory handbook . 1<sup>st</sup> Ed. Vikas & Co: 2010.

*Online Database*

**Name of the database. Name of the book. Place. Year: Web address: Accessed on.**

*Online Document*

**Document title. Author name: Web address: Accessed on.**

**Illustrations and figures** were kept after references and title of the figure with figure number given in manuscript should specify beneath every figure.

**Tables** were kept after figures and title of the table with table number given in manuscript should specify on every table.
